- Have a high school diploma or GED
- Maintain <270 lbs. weight
- Be nicotine and drug free
- Pass pre-employment testing
- Electrical Lineworker Apprentice Certification (ELAC) through a technical college is highly desirable

Pre-Employment Testing

- Construction and Skilled Trade Test (CAST) - Measures math problem-solving, comprehension of mechanical principles, and reading comprehension
